Intro

What's a YWE?

Youth worker exchanges are part of the European Erasmus+ programme which offers opportunities to organize projects for the mobility of young people and youth workers.

For youth workers, organizations can take part in opportunities to support the professional development, capacity building, network of youth workers and thereby the development of quality youth work at local, regional, national, European and international level, through non-formal and informal learning experiences in mobility. More specifically, mobility projects for youth workers aim to:



- Provide non-formal and informal learning opportunities for educational and professional development of youth workers;
- Build a community of youth workers that can support the quality of projects and activities for young people in EU programmes and beyond;
- Develop local youth work practices and contribute to capacity building for quality youth work of the participants and their organization, having a clear impact on the participating youth workers' regular work with young people.


Who can participate

The project targets youth workers from all over Europe who work closely with young people and the EU topics, such as youth workers, info desk, European foundations or realities *etc...* To take part in the project you must be involved in youth information and orientation activities and you must belong to an organization involved in such activities. A total of 24 youth workers can take part in this exchange, with each partner sending maximum 2.





The exchange will take place from the 13th till the 19th of November 24 (13 and 19 being travel days).




The house is located in Candriai di Monte Bondone, a locality of Trento. Here you have some pictures of the house.



Board and lodging are provided by our organization during the whole youth worker exchange.



The house is a self-catering house with a nice equipped kitchen, a common room and big shared bedrooms. We will cook together our meals in a community environment.



International travel

Actual travel expenses from the country of residence to the place of exchange will be reimbursed up to the amount indicated below. The refund will be made after receiving of the complete travel documents.

The maximum amount of travel costs will be calculated according to your residence in your country up to the place where the exchange takes place.

Travel

Eligible transportation

Participants must travel by public transportation (plane, train, buses) in the dates specified (13 and 19; max 12 and 20) in order to get the reimbursement.

Travel distance	Standar travel

100 - 499 km	180€

2000 - 2999 km	360€

How to get to Trento

By Aeroplane

Trento doesn't have an airport. Therefore we have to choose the closest airport to Trento that has a good bus or train connection.

We recommend Bergamo (BGY) as it has a good Flixbus connection to Trento. Depending on your finances and ease you can choose either of the listed options.

NOTE: after landing in Italy, you have to use either a car to reach Trento. Do make sure that here is a FlixBus or a train connection that matches your flight.

By Train

For some, the train might make more sense. Trento's station is located in Piazza Dante. You can buy the train tickets online.

By Bus

You can reach Trento easily by Flixbus which stops 600 meters away from the train station.

Important


We recommend not to book return tickets for early morning in order to have time to reach the airport (see first bus/train connections): it will be difficult to find transport to your chosen airport early in the morning.

Civico 13

Civico13 is a youth information desk, which aim is providing information to youngsters on job, volenteering opporunities. Civico13 is also Eurodesk point which gives information to youngsters on Erasmus+ programme and ESC programme.

Civico13 offers orientation services for young people regarding work, CV writing, volunteering, going abroad.

Fondazione Trentina Alcide De Gasperi

The Alcide De Gasperi Trentino Foundation was established in 2007 by the Autonomous Province of Trento and the Luigi Sturzo Institute in Rome.

It carries out research, training and cultural dissemination activities aimed at deepening and enhancing the figure of the great statesman from Trentino.
