**SPACESHIP**

E - L E A R N I N G   S O L U T I O N S

SPACESHIP focuses on elevating digital non-formal education by empowering youth workers with enhanced digital and soft skills. The project aims to create a collaborative environment for skill exchange, and pooling experiences to develop innovative learning tools. The primary outcome is to boost the quality and recognition of digital non-formal education through the creation of sustainable tools, enabling youth workers to deliver high-quality online activities for the benefit of the youth.

The activity in Denmark focuses on piloting the Moodle course. The core objectives involve directly training youth workers, obtaining feedback on e-learning modules, and enabling them to transfer gained knowledge to their local communities. The activity aims to impart digital skills to youth workers, encouraging disadvantaged youth to explore online self-development and enhance future career prospects. The project aims to create an innovative learning tool, refining the Moodle course based on feedback, to enhance youth work interactions with technology and provide online services for harder-to-reach young people.

ARRIVAL AIRPORTS

We suggest arriving at **Aarhus, Billund, or Aalborg** airport as they are the closest to Aarhus.

You can also arrive in **Copenhagen**, but keep in mind that in this case, you have to travel 3-4 hours extra to get to Aarhus.

## **BLL AIRPORT**

Bus 912X ([tickets and schedule](#)). You can also buy ticket on the bus and you can pay by card as well.

## **AAR AIRPORT**

Bus 925X ([tickets and schedule](#)) - the departure time of the bus is synchronized with all arrival flights. You can also buy ticket on the bus and you can pay by card as well.

## **AAL AIRPORT**

Local bus from the airport to the train station and then either train or Flixbus to Aarhus. Tickets for local buses and schedules can be checked [here](#), while for the trains you can use [this one](#).

## **CPH AIRPORT**

You can either take the train ([tickets and schedule](#)) or Flixbus.

The bus ticket prices are always the same, but we suggest to buy your train ticket as soon as possible, as the train ticket prices in Denmark are more expensive if you buy closer to the day of the departure.



ACCOMMODATION

Participants will be accommodated in twin rooms at [Hotel Atlantic Aarhus](#).

The hotel is situated in the heart of Aarhus. All rooms at Hotel Atlantic are equipped with a TV featuring Chromecast and cable channels, a work desk, and a private bathroom with a hairdryer. Guests can enjoy a breakfast buffet served in the hotel's dining room on the 10th floor, offering scenic views of the city. Aarhus Central Station is within a convenient 10-minute walk from the hotel. Restaurants, cafes, and shops are easily accessible on foot in the area.

# AARHUS

Aarhus is the second-largest city in Denmark. A vibrant mix of youthful energy and a blast from the past makes Aarhus a city with an energetic beat of the pulse. In Aarhus, everything is within walking distance. From here, beach, harbor and forest are all within reach of a 15-minute bike ride.



# PUBLIC TRANSPORT

The city center of Aarhus is not so big, so almost everything is within walking distance. If you would like to discover more than just the city center, the most convenient is to buy a daily ticket, which you can use on every bus and on the Letbanen (tram) in Aarhus.

**WHAT TO DO IN THE CITY?**

- Møllestien - one of the most beautiful streets in Aarhus!
- Salling ROOFTOP - enjoy the city view from above and take a look down through the transparent glass bridge. No entrance fee, opening hours: 10.00-20.00. Address: Søndergade 27, 8000 Aarhus
- Aarhus Cathedral - explore the Gothic cathedral, the longest in Denmark, and check out its historical importance! Bonus, you can visit the tower and enjoy a look over the city center (payable)! Opening hours: 09.30- 16.00, no entrance fee, address: Store Torv, 8000 Aarhus





- Dokk1 – it's a multicultural building, where constant expositions are held and from where you can get a code for free wi-fi access in the facility and some location in the city center!
- Latin quarter – if you decide that any of the previous sights are not remarkable for you or you may have visited them, then I recommend you to walk through the Latin Quarter. You explore the many small and crocheted streets and relax at one of the multiple local pubs with a lemonade or a traditional Carlsberg beer!
- By the River – take a walk along the river, enjoy the promenade, the sun and get to know the city vibe! Enjoying a beer by the river or a warm meal may be a bit pricier than expected. Hence, you may look around the Bispetervet (Aarhus Cathedral and Aarhus Theatre) where there are plenty of options to choose from!




# SIGHTSEEING

- Marselisborg Deer Park – If you chose this destination, please consider that you will visit wild animals in their natural habitat. The deers are sociable and friendly with visitors. However, to make sure that you will have cool memories and Instagram pictures, we suggest you to go and buy some apples or carrots. You will see later why!
- ARoS Museum – AROS is the cultural centerpiece of Aarhus, and one of the largest museums of its kind in Northern Europe.





- Den Gamble By – The Old City is a national open-air museum of urban history and culture in Denmark through three centuries. The museum consists of more than 75 historic houses relocated from all over Denmark. Besides the historic section, there are more than 34 workshops and shops as well as a pharmacy, a school, a post office, a telephone exchange, a jazz bar, and much more.
- The Botanical Garden – Next to Den Gamble By you can find the Botanical Garden with a greenhouse where you can see many beautiful plants all year round.
- Risskov Forest – It is a beautiful green area close to the city center, where you can find one of the best views of the harbor.
